# **32<sup>nd</sup> Annual TESOL-SPAIN Convention**

**March 13th-15th 2009**

## **Preliminary Convention Programme**

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The 32nd TESOL-Spain theme: Blending Tradition with Innovation: Does “new” always mean “good”? The Convention theme for 2009 aims to re-explore the tried and tested and also to consider the fields of activity both inside and outside of ELT that offer new insights and forms of activity to the ways in which we teach. Reflection and exploration by teachers, materials writers and curriculum developers can be a powerful vehicle for professional development. Areas of interest include teacher training, methodology, curriculum design, materials development, classroom practice, testing and evaluation, teacher interaction, CLIL and of course information technology.

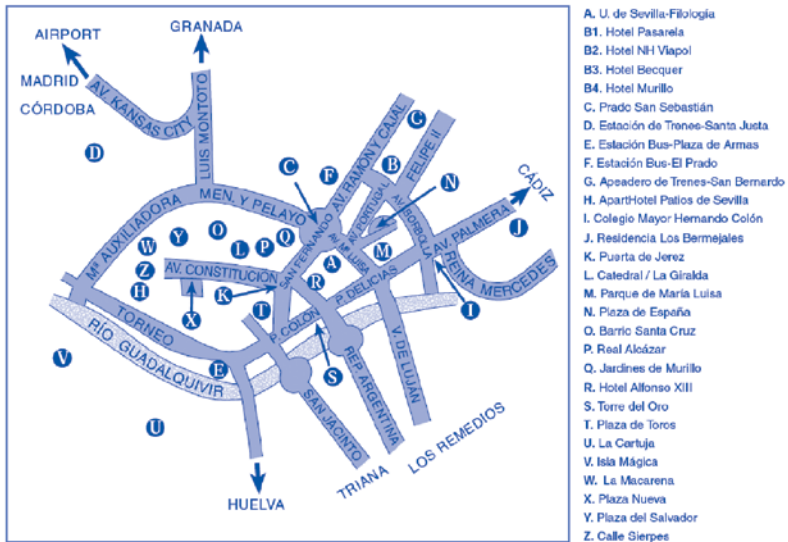
The Convention offers participants a wide range of presentations by national and international speakers, including plenary and keynote presentations, papers, workshops, round tables and product presentations. It is attended by a wide variety of EFL professionals. There are teachers from infant, primary and secondary schools, from E.O.I.s, universities, technical schools and academies, as well as teacher trainers, materials writers and course planners. Publishers, ELT researchers, members of testing boards, national and international authors also take part in the Convention.

TESOL-SPAIN and Seville welcome you to our 32nd Annual National Convention. The capital of Andalusia and her exquisite monuments promise to host another unforgettable Convention whose site will be the University of Seville, an 18th-century construction originally built for a tobacco factory. It lies in the heart of Seville, one block from the luscious Maria Luisa Park and two blocks from the Cathedral and its towering Giralda.

This pre-programme publication is intended to give you a taste of what’s to come, to guide you through what you need to do to participate, and to make the most of what’s on offer. Although there are still bits to be tightened up and some details are subject to change, I hope it serves this purpose and that you find the coming Convention an event worthy of your support. ## CONVENTION LOCATION

The 32nd Annual National TESOL-SPAIN Convention will be held at the University of Seville in the Facultad de Filología with an entrance on c/ San Fernando, 4. You may enter the university from this side when gates are open. Walk through interior courtyards until you come to the registration area. This street also has various restaurants for lunch. Another entrance is on c/ Palos de la Frontera. Enter through this main entrance and you will immediately see the registration area in the Faculty of Languages (Facultad de Filología). The first entrance is closed on Sundays. The University is in the center of town and there are shops, banks, restaurants, bars, etc. within easy reach. It sits between two major bus stops, one in the Puerta de Jerez and the other in the Prado.



## GETTING AROUND SEVILLE

Traveling around Seville by public transport is relatively easy. The bus system is regular and there are two major stops on either side of the University. A one-way bus ticket is 1,20 € and can be purchased directly from the driver. There is also a 10-ride bus pass that can be purchased at almost any newsstand for 6 €. Taxis are relatively inexpensive and available. If not in peak-hours during the main fiestas, you can get a taxi very quickly. Wait for one with the green light on and wave your hand. The price is around 7 € from north to south of the city center. This is a good option for those touring during the late hours. To arrive at the Convention site from one of the convention hotels is a 6- to 15-minute walk. Following is some basic information to acquaint participants. ### By air

A taxi from the airport is a flat rate of 22 € one way and this should include baggage charges. There is an airport bus, that leaves the airport every half hour. It has three stops with the last being at the Hotel Alfonso XIII, which is right next to the University (the Convention site). A one-way ticket is 2,30 €.

### By rail

A taxi from Santa Justa Train Station should cost between 6 € and 8 € to the site or to any of the convention hotels. There is bus #C2, which can be picked up very near the taxi stop as you walk out of the station and it stops a block from the Convention site. Ask for the Prado bus stop.

\*Note: All prices are approximate and as of January 2009.

There will be information about local facilities around the Convention site available at the conference information desk.

A reduction has been negotiated with RENFE on all trains of 30% per one way journey. To be eligible for these discounts you must present the valid TESOL discount voucher to a RENFE travel agent or even at any station (discounts cannot be booked through internet). These vouchers can be obtained personally at Jenny's office or by sending a stamped addressed envelope stating the number of vouchers required. The validity of these vouchers is between the 11th and 17th of March 2009 for those who wish to do some sightseeing before or after the Convention. PLEASE NOTE THAT DUE TO A LIMITED NUMBER OF VOUCHERS PRINTED THESE WILL ONLY BE AVAILABLE FOR PEOPLE MAKING ACCOMMODATION RESERVATIONS THROUGH JENNY. ### By bus

*Prado de San Sebastián* provides bus services to cities of Andalusia, whereas *Plaza de Armas* connects with the rest of Spain and the province of Huelva.

## ARRIVING IN SEVILLE

### Hotels

All hotels are within walking distance of the convention centre but please note that the sooner you make the booking the better because for this weekend accommodation is limited in Seville. Prices listed on TESOL-SPAIN website are per person per night and include buffet breakfast unless stated and VAT. These prices are for the nights of 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> March 2009 ONLY. Extra nights will be quoted for separately on request. For those requiring invoices, fiscal details will be needed, but be warned that invoicing is the last part of the job. The principle part is to get accommodation and this all has to be done in stages.

A reservations deposits will be required to guarantee the booking, a 50% deposit will be required with the balance to be paid one month in advance. Once the reservations have been confirmed, cancellations can only be considered if adequate proof (e.g. medical) can be provided as why the person cannot attend. ALL RESERVATIONS ARE ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS. Please check on a regular basis because allocations are reducing already in some hotels due to bookings. ### **Pre-registration and Registration**

#### **Tradition and Innovation: The English Language Today**

There are rapid developments in the English Language world-wide. New descriptions of English using multi-million word corpora are also generating new insights into grammar and vocabulary which present challenges for our course materials and teaching methodologies. At the same time there are innovative developments in the English language, such as Internet English. This talk will discuss how teachers face a genuine challenge to blend creativity and innovation with traditions of existing knowledge and good classroom practice.

**Ronald Carter** is Professor of English at the University of Nottingham. He has written more than 50 books and 100 articles in the fields of applied linguistics and the teaching of English and has taught in over thirty countries. His recent books include: *Cambridge Grammar of English* (Cambridge University Press, 2006), winner of the 2007 British Council English Language Innovation Award.

### **Blending the Ancient Need for Stories with Classroom Practice**

Human beings live through stories, and we neglect this fact in language teaching at our peril. Although there have been a number of books about using story-telling in ELT, there has been no systematic attempt to work on story-writing as a skill. This Plenary will show some ways in which teachers can help their learners to become writers of stories.

## PECHA KUCHA DINNER

Pecha Kucha is an innovative form of giving presentations. Speakers illustrate their talks with twenty PowerPoint slides, each shown for only twenty seconds, allowing for six minutes and forty seconds of fame before the next presenter is on.
